We are pleased to announce our 31st conference is being organised by Prof Thomas Clancy and Dr Sofia Evemalm-Graham. It will be held at the Stirling Court Hotel, which is situated on the leafy campus of the University of Stirling. There will be a full programme, beginning with an **opening lecture** on the environmental and social history of the Stirling area by Prof. Richard Oram of the University of Stirling on the evening of Friday 11th, and full days of **papers** and **project reports** on Saturday 12th and Sunday 13th, including a **coach trip** on Sunday afternoon to Dunblane Cathedral and Doune Castle.

The hotel, which is part of the University of Stirling, is very well set up with conference facilities, and has excellent transport links by rail and bus. The campus of the University of Stirling is a spacious and green one, overlooked by the Ochils. There are a number of monuments within a half hour's walking distance: Logie Kirk, the Wallace Monument, Stirling Old Bridge; and the historic town of Stirling with its castle is a short bus-ride away.

We are also arranging a pre-conference student/post graduate/early career event which will be held on the Friday afternoon (specific times TBA and can be made flexible depending on travel arrangements of attendees). The event is free to attend for conference delegates. Any non-member student members wishing to attend are asked to register as a student member (£5 per annum).

The coach trip to Dunblane Cathedral and Doune Castle (including entrance fees) will be circa £25 booked separately. This will be supported by historical and onomastic talks and guidance from Prof. Dauvit Broun and Dr Peter McNiven. It will take place on the Sunday afternoon between 1300 and 1730.

Speakers and topics currently include: John Baker (Nottingham), tbc; Sofia Evemalm-Graham (Glasgow) on Death and Iona place-names; Peder Gammeltoft (Bergen) on AI and onomastics; Jake King (UHI) on the names of islands in Loch Lomond; Peter Kitson on adjectives and river names; Chris Lewis on the transferred name Cuilfail; Peter McNiven on the place-names of the Stirling area; Conchubhar Ó Crualaoich (Dublin), on evidence for Welsh settlers in place-names in Ireland; Justin Ó Gliasáin (Dublin), on Scottish influence on Donegal place-names; Aengus Ó Fionnagáin (Limerick) on the Irish Schools Folklore Collection and minor place-names; Bill Paterson on Eldbotle and other names in Dirleton parish.
